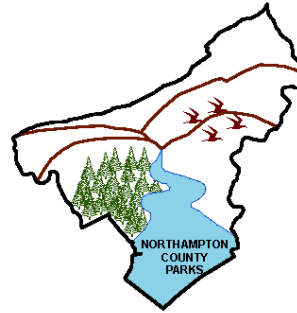
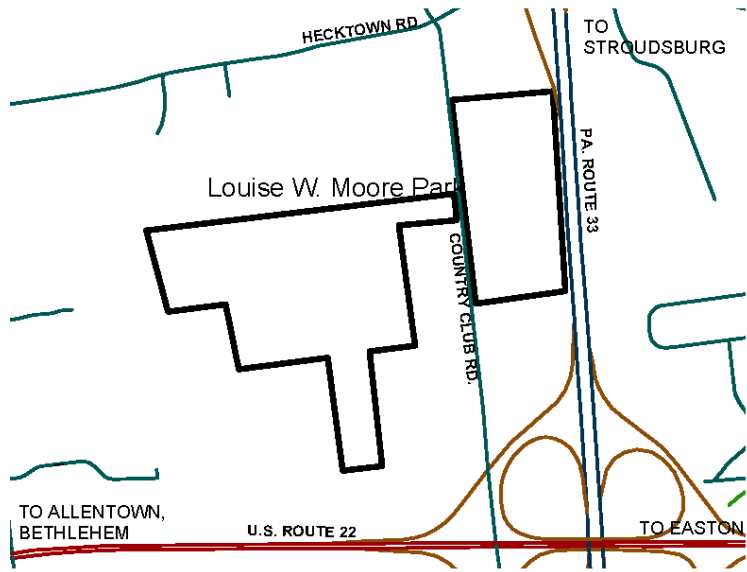
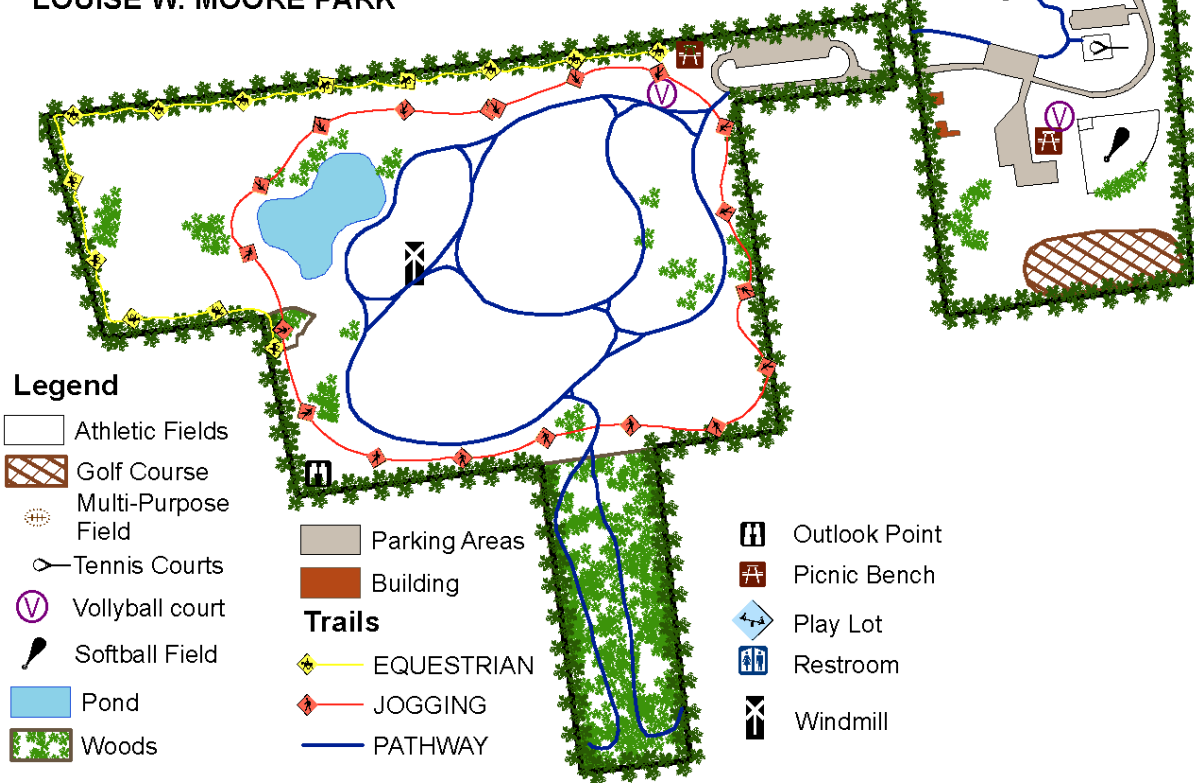

The **Louise W. Moore County Park** is a friendly place in a rural setting on Country Club Road in Lower Nazareth and Bethlehem Townships. The park provides opportunities for enjoying open space, exploring the beautiful wooded areas, and experiencing a sense of excitement in a carefully planned setting. Its convenient location near the intersections of Routes 22 and 33 make it easily accessible to all of Northampton County and most parts of eastern Pennsylvania. We invite you to enjoy the facilities and 113 acres of natural beauty at the **Louise W. Moore County Park**.

Recreational Opportunities

Picnic and play areas include four picnic pavilions and open areas, which are available for family and group use.

A distinctive and unusual sculpture play lot is the focal point of the children's play areas. The sculpture motifs, designed especially for the Park, provide an imaginative setting for young children's recreation. In addition to this feature, there are swing sets and other areas for children's use.

Scenic Features

The **Louise W. Moore County Park** is noted as much for its setting as its recreational features. Many people visit the Park to see and appreciate its beauty.

In the distance, a windmill provides a picturesque landscape and Matson's wood contain 6.6 acres of mature oak woodland ideal for nature study as well as leisurely strolls along the fern lined paths.

In addition, the Park lies in the migration route of many North American song and game birds.



The **Louise W. Moore County Park** has an arboretum, which was carefully designed to include trees from North America, Europe, and Asia.

Accessibility

The Park has been developed so there is easy access to the Park's features for the handicapped. The Park staff is actively involved in encouraging use of the Park's facilities and welcomes questions about such use.

Park Regulations

- **Hours:** Sunrise to Sunset Daily
- **Automobile Parking:** Visitors may park in designated areas only. There is parking for approximately 250 cars.
- **Permits:** Required for groups of 10 or more people, for bringing alcoholic beverages into the park, and for other activities
- **Sports Equipment:** Visitors must supply their own sports equipment for activities in the Park
